The relationship between the Committee for Mineral Reserves International Reporting Standards (CRIRSCO) and the United Nations Framework Classification for Resources (UNFC) has continued to evolve since 1997. The Pan-European Reserves and Resources Reporting Committee (PERC) is a member of CRIRSCO and is recognised as the National Reporting Organisation (NRO) for Europe.

The CRIRSCO Template is recognised by the UNECE's Expert Group on Resource Management as an aligned system for application in the minerals sector. This is supported by the CRIRSCO Template to UNFC Bridging Document, which was revised in 2024, with the publication of an accompanying guidance note on its usage.

In this workshop several of these topics will be elaborated using presentations and practical exercises. Specific topics to be covered will include:

- Overview of CRIRSCO, PERC, UNECE and the EGRM
- The CRIRSCO Template to UNFC Bridging Document and the Guidance Note on its use
- PERC's Mineral Project Evaluation Report template and its use in managing mineral project information through the life of a project
- The use of UNFC for national and regional mineral inventories
- The UNFC and the EU's Critical Raw Materials Act
- EU Strategic Projects –important considerations
